EMOS-Infineer install MIDAS Cashless Catering System into 10 new schools run by the SEELB after winning the tender. Adding to the existing schools EMOS-Infineer manage

- Centralised reporting for the SEELB and better management information
- Increase in students using Free School Meals, as using fingerprints now makes it anonymous.
- A good tool in introducing money management to students.

The schools range from small High schools to large Colleges. Some of the larger schools integrated their prep and Primary schools into the system. All schools have MIDAS installed with biometrics as a form of identification with PIN number as back up. MIDAS was installed onto a Captia supplied server on the C2K network with integration to SIMS to automate free meals and download photos etc.

The 10 schools were Regent HS 1,581 students, St Colmcilles High school 372 students, St Columbanus College 608 Students, St Malachy's High School 1015 Students, Down High School 1025 Students, Glasry College 638 Students, Glenlola Collegiate 1132 Students, Lisnagarvey 679 Students, St Colm's High School 610 Students, FortHill College 1200 Students.

The *MIDAS* software has been designed with administration personnel in mind and it is intended to be as user friendly as possible. All applications are controlled from the Task Pad, to make navigation of the management options as clear and simple as possible. To minimise training requirements, *MIDAS* management tools are grouped by application.

Care has been exercised to make the administrator's job as easy as possible when carrying out day-to-day operations and routine maintenance. Wizards are used to guide the administrator through the execution of various management tasks such as replacing lost tokens, installing a new terminal etc.
